Test of English as Foreign Language (TOEFL) Training for Medical Record Students in Bengkulu

One of the skill that medical record students must possess is English. This of course makes many students find it difficult to meet the standard of TOEFL score because lack of understanding in English by some students. Through TOEFL training, participants will get listening, writing, and reading tests. The method used in this community service is a descriptive method through a qualitative approach. This method was chosen because it presents data systematically and accurately regarding the facts in the field. Based on the data, it shows that more than 50%, namely 87.5% (21 students) have a TOEFL score above the criteria, which is 425 indicating that there is an increase in the TOEFL score after the training.

Just like the TOEFL test in general, in this test the participants will get listening, writing, and reading tests where the results will be obtained 1 week after the test is done. TOEFL (Test Of English As Foreign Language) is an English proficiency test that is recognized in various parts of the world. This type of TOEFL English test is generally required for graduation requirements for undergraduate (S-1) and graduate (S-2 or S-3) programs. TOEFL test results are also used as material for consideration of the English language skills of prospective students who apply to universities in other countries. This test lasts three hours and is held in 4 parts, namely, sections: Listening comprehension, grammar structure and written expression, reading comprehension and writing. Listening comprehension is a section or section that tests students' ability to listen to conversations or short speeches in English through tape or audio media, structure and written expression is a section or section that tests students' ability to understand English grammar and common expressions contained in written English. In addition, this section also requires students' ability to use and find out where the error is in an expression or grammar

such as tenses, prhasal verbs, tobe [4]. Reading comprehension is a section or section that tests students' ability to understand various types of scientific readings related to topics, main ideas, reading content, meanings of words or groups of words, as well as detailed information related to a reading. The purpose of reading is to grasp or understand the text. In reading, there are many skills that can be improved. The students may increase their ability of listening, speaking, and writing skills through reading. They can also enrich their knowledge of speaking expression, English sentence structure, the English instruction of the text, writing techniques and vocabulary mastery through reading [5].

TOEFL has two general objectives, namely: Academic and General. TOEFL academic purposes are for research purposes or related to academic activities abroad, or in Indonesia [6]. Atmowardoyo (2018) classified TOEFL score into four levels; elementary level (310-420), low intermediate level (420-480), high intermediate level (480-520), and advanced level (525-677). For postgraduates, usually the minimum score is 550 while for S1 it is 500. General purposes are generally used in the field of work, promotion or work assignments. And many companies set the standard for their employees' English by looking at the TOEFL score. Generally, the minimum TOEFL score is 500 for standard promotions [7].

B. Methods

The method used in this community service is a descriptive method through a qualitative approach. This method was chosen because it presents data systematically and accurately regarding the facts in the field. Descriptive aims to describe, explain, and answer in more detail the problems to be studied by studying as much as possible an individual, or group, or an event. Descriptive method with a qualitative approach aims to explore the facts of students' English proficiency.

Based on the pre-test conducted, there were facts related to the English language skills of medical record students. The following is a summary of the TOEFL:

Related to the data, an evaluation of the factors that affect students' English proficiency is carried out. Based on the table above, it shows that more than 50%, namely 87.5% (21 students) of MEDICAL RECORD have TOEFL scores above the criteria, which are 425. More than half of students have TOEFL scores above the criteria, indicating that there is an increase in TOEFL scores after training. The factors that influence the increase in TOEFL scores are understanding strategies in answering TOEFL questions, students are able to understand the context and meaning of conversations in English, understand language and grammar rules, understand reading content and are able to express ideas coherently in written form.
